

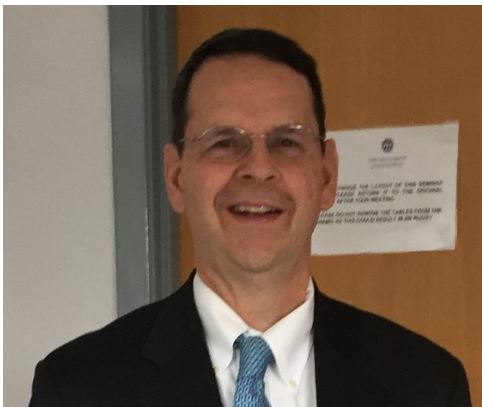

Scottish Trauma Network – Care of Burns in Scotland - SABIN Trauma Conference

The Scottish Trauma Network is collaborating with the Scottish Acquired Brain Injury Network (SABIN), the Care of Burns in Scotland (COBIS) as well as the Scottish Trauma Audit Group (STAG) to bring together NHS staff from across Scotland on the 26th & 27th June. We are expecting around 250-300 attendees from across the country, covering all disciplines that care for patients who have suffered serious injury.

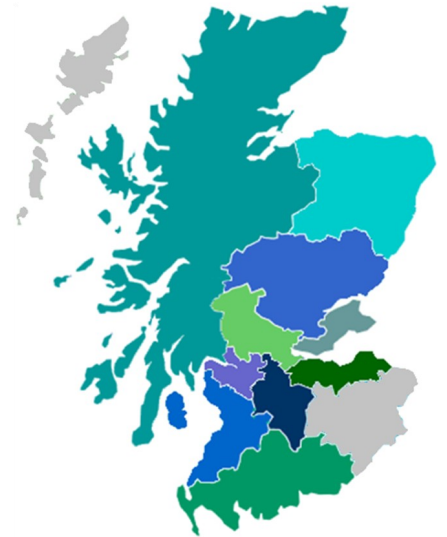
What's Happening in our Working Groups?

Data Collection

We are refining what we think would be useful data to collect, and our next step is to cross check this with colleagues in the dedicated Scottish rehabilitation centres. We look forward to providing an update.

Children and Young People

At the most recent Paediatric sub group meeting, we started scoping a Scotland-wide head injury discharge advice leaflet for A&E for use after a mild concussion. We also explored the need for more routine follow-up for some children after discharge. We'll update you with more details soon!
